The year 2025-26 has been a remarkable year of growth, service, and impact for Primary Healthcare Foundation.

With the generous support of our donors, CSR partners, government agencies, and community stakeholders, we successfully expanded healthcare access to underserved and tribal populations across Maharashtra.

Our Mobile Medical Units continued to provide Non-Communicable Disease (NCD) screening and primary healthcare services in Melghat (Amravati), Umred, and Hingana (Nagpur), reaching thousands of beneficiaries in remote areas.

We successfully upgraded Primary Health Centres at Khanu, Oni, and Pisai, as well as the Rural Hospital at Pali in Ratnagiri district. These healthcare facilities now serve nearly 2.5 lakh rural residents with improved infrastructure and better healthcare delivery systems.

Despite challenges such as difficult terrain, heavy monsoon conditions in Konkan, and the shortage of skilled healthcare professionals in remote regions, our team delivered projects within committed timelines.

We are also proud to have conducted baseline studies and impact assessments for more than 25 NGO projects, supporting evidence-based social development initiatives.

As we move forward, we remain committed to strengthening rural healthcare infrastructure and ensuring quality healthcare services reach every underserved community.
